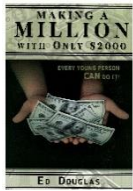

This book, written by a banker, shows how small amounts of regular and disciplined saving and wise investing can accumulate to \$1,000,000 and much more using the Rule of 72.

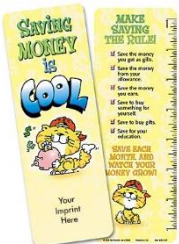
Bookmarks

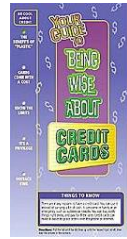


It's Cool to Save Pencils and Foil Money Pencils

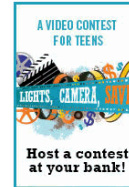

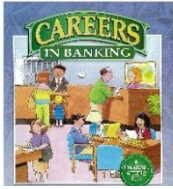

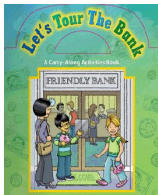

Activity Books



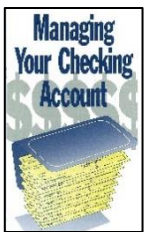
Careers in Banking

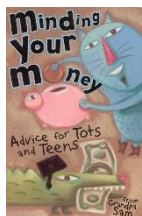
Let's Tour the Bank

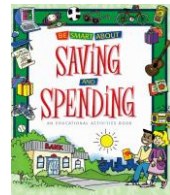
This brochure not only teaches the concepts of spending, saving and

investing, but it also serves as a personal savings record in which students can track their deposits and interest.



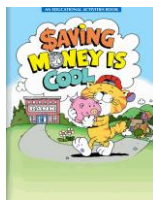
Personal Finance Booklet Series: Saving & Checking
